





## For Students in the Master's Program

Number of credits required for Master's Program completion

• Students of both the Department of Economic Engineering and the Department of Economic Systems have to take a minimum of 30 credits.

• Instruction related to the Master's Thesis ('Supervision for Master's Thesis' on page 15 and page 18 of Handbook for International Students): 8 credits (Mandatory)

 This is common to students in the master's program of both departments.

## For Double-Degree Students of the Department of Economic Engineering

✓ In addition to 8 credits of 'Supervision for Master's Thesis', students have to take a minimum of 22 credits of subjects chosen from 'Elective Subjects', 'Frontier Studies' and 'Research Workshop.'

✓ Among 22 credits, you should take at least 6 credits of 'Elective Subjects' on the top of page 14 of Handbook.

# For Double-Degree Students of the Department of Economic Systems

In addition to 8 credits of 'Supervision for Master's Thesis', students have to take 2 credits of 'Methodology of Economic Studies' (Mandatory, held at spring semester) as well as a minimum of 20 credits of subjects chosen from 'Elective Subjects', 'Frontier Studies' and 'Research Workshop'.

# For IPPE Students of the Department of Economic Engineering

✓ In addition to 8 credits of 'Supervision for Master's Thesis', students have to take a minimum of 22 credits of subjects chosen from 'Core Subjects', 'Advanced Subjects' and 'Research Workshop.'

✓ Among 22 credits, you should take at least 6 credits of 'Core Subjects' on the top of page 19 of Handbook.

# For IPFBE Students of the Department of Economic Engineering

- ✓ In addition to 8 credits of 'Supervision for Master's Thesis', students have to take a minimum of 22 credits of subjects chosen from 'Core Subjects', 'Advanced Core Subjects', 'Management Studies Subjects', 'Practical Business Studies Subjects', 'Advanced Econoics Subjects' and 'Research Workshop.'
- ✓ Econometrics III in Core Subjects is Compulsory.
- ✓ Among 22 credits, you should take at least 4~6 credits of each category on pp.21-22 of Handbook.

## For IPMA Students of the Department of Economic Systems

- ✓ In addition to 8 credits of 'Supervision for Master's Thesis', students have to take a minimum of 22 credits of subjects chosen from 'Core Subjects', 'Advanced Core Subjects', 'Economic Theory and Applied Subjects', 'Practical Business Studies Subjects', 'Advanced Economics Subjects' and 'Research Workshop.'
- ✓ Among 22 credits, you should take at least 4~6 credits of each category on pp.23-24 of Handbook.

## For Students in the **Doctor**'s Program

- Students of both the Department of Economic Engineering and the Department of Economic Systems have to take a minimum of 8 credits, including 4 credits of 'Supervision for Doctor's Thesis' (Mandatory).
- Research Workshop is compulsory in doctoral program except of IPMA.
- •Details of Requirements for Doctoral student in each course/program are different.
